Principal activities

The principal activities of the Company in the course of the financial period were the provision of a Licensed Club and mens and women's bowling facilities.
No significant change in the nature of those activities occurred during the period.

Review and results of operations

The consolidated Operating Loss was \$77,347 after providing for Income Tax amounting to \$NIL.
This compares with consolidated operating Loss for 2019 of \$127,686.

This resulted after charging \$ 156,143 (2019: \$170,559) for depreciation, loss on sale of plant and amortisation.

Dividends

The Company is a non-profit organisation and is prevented by its constitution from paying dividends.

State of affairs

In the opinion of the Directors there were no other significant changes in the state of affairs of the Company that occurred during the financial period under review.

Environmental regulation

The Company's operations are subject to various environmental regulations under both Commonwealth and State legislation.
The Board believes that the Company has adequate systems in place for the management of its environmental requirements and is not aware of any breach of those environmental requirements as they apply to the Company.

Likely developments

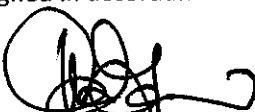
The directors do not anticipate any particular development in the operations of the Company which will affect the results in subsequent years.

DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

CONSOLIDATED INCOME STATEMENT

The Club's total revenue has decreased by \$ 126,702 since the prior year. Total expenses have decreased by \$162,629 resulting in a consolidated Loss before Income Tax of \$77,347 as compared to a consolidated Loss before Income Tax of \$127,686 for the previous year.

Individual items that have impacted the 2020 result include:

- Decrease in Bar Sales \$78,949
- Decrease in Net Poker Machine takings by \$104,228
- Increase in Government Subsidies and Grants by \$85,557
- Decrease in Depreciation by \$14,416
- Decrease in Cleaning by \$11,305
- Decrease in Donations and Community Activities by \$9,805
- Decrease in Poker Night Costs by \$28,374

CONSOLIDATED BALANCE SHEET

The Company's net assets have increased by \$222,653 due mainly to a revaluation of the Club's Freehold Land by \$300,000.

The Club's total assets has increased by \$237,531 and total liabilities has increased by \$14,878

Cash, Cash Equivalents and Financial Assets as at 30 June 2020 were \$634,349 compared to \$634,816 a decline of \$467.

Short Term Borrowings Increased by \$24,424 due to finance arrangements to fund the acquisition of 2 Poker machines.

CONSOLIDATED CASH FLOW

Operating activities provided net cash surplus of \$128,530 compared to a net cash deficit of \$20,680 for the previous year.

Net cash used in investing activities of \$83,401 mainly relates to the acquisition of Plant, equipment and Poker machines during the year.

Net cash used in financing activities of \$54,529 relates to the repayment of principal and interest on borrowings.

The net decrease in cash held during the year was \$ 9,400 compared to an decrease of \$257,766 for the previous year.

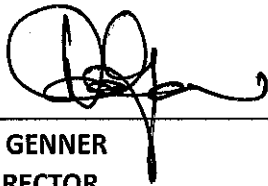
